If your test results indicate that you **DO** have COVID-19, you should remain in home isolation until:

- 1.) You have had no fever for at least 24 hours (that is three full days of no fever without the use of medicine that reduces fevers)

AND

- 2.) At least 10 days have passed since your symptoms first appeared

AND

- 3.) Other symptoms have improved/resolved (for example, cough or shortness of breath).

Patients who tested positive for COVID-19 should isolate themselves from household members as much as possible. **Household members** should avoid public activities for **14 days after the ill person meets the above criteria for being released from isolation.**

Possible Example:

John Doe tested positive for COVID-19 and was ill with fever, cough, and body aches. He uses Tylenol for 11 days and then starts to feel better. John needs to remain in isolation for 12 days (24 hours after last use of fever reducing medication).

He lives with his wife, Jane Doe. Jane would need to remain in isolation for 26 days (12 days for John's illness **plus 14 extra days.**)
